





#### SABINA KHATRI Founder & Chairperson Kiran Foundation



Founder and Chairperson of Kiran Foundation, Sabina Khatri was announced as the recipient of highly prestigious civilian award, Sitara-e-Imtiaz, on 14 August 2020.

Her journey with Kiran began when she was following a child abuse and domestic violence case in Lyari. At the time, such heinous crimes were common there and though she did now have any trained background in education, she went into Lyari with the determination to change things and save its children. She was a mere nutrition and fitness instructor by education, came from a well-settled family and largely a stay-at-home mother. Yet she powered through the streets of Lyari at a time when most people would not even drive by the drug and gang war-stricken community.

Today, Kiran has grown from its Ibtedai school to Kiran Foundation and DCTO College and is growing even more, all thanks to one super mama who had the courage to take the first step for Lyari and its people. #### AZIMA DHANJEE Co-Founder ConnectHear



What started as a passion project close to her heart (and home!), has now turned into one of the largest Deaf accessibility service providers in South Asia. ConnectHear works for sign language accessibility and deaf inclusion in Pakistan by leveraging technology.

Being raised by deaf parents, Azima took it upon herself to use technology-based solutions to bring ease to differently abled people through her and we couldn't be prouder of her dedication to the cause. ConnectHear is building a real-time sign language recognition A.I. that will enable Deaf people to have independent access to information and communication.

What is even more outstanding is that Azima has set up her business in 2017 with her high school friends, at the age of 19 whilst undergoing her Bachelors Degree at IBA, Karachi. ## PRIYA K. CUTTS Founder Female Tech Leaders



Priya is the founder of Female Tech Leaders, and a full-time Project Manager at Motive (previously KeepTruckin'), an organization that supports development and growth of women in technology through community events, digital resources, and mentorship.

While talking about mentoring women, she points out,

'One of the hardest things as women is that we don't self-advocate very well and there's a lot of impostor syndrome of feeling that you and I still have it. I'm 15 years into this career and I still have impostor syndrome where I'm like have they made a mistake? What's happening right now? And I think working through that is just such a generational systemic thing and so I put a lot of focus on things like your self worth and your worthiness, and the fact and I think for me that's an important part of my journey is that you don't have to fit a mold to be successful in time.'

## **ElleConnect '22**

GrowElle Labs celebrated Pakistan's 1st ever Ada Lovelace Day on Sunday 2nd October 2022, with a virtual conference called **ElleConnect**, featuring Pakistani women across the board. The virtual PanEllas & Fem Featurettes had a primary focus on Developing Women With STFM.

With power houses like Baela Jamil of Idara e Taleem o Aagahi as our Keynote Speaker, Amneh Farooqui of WOW Festival & Polly & Other Stories, Sidra Riaz, Urooj Seemeen, Maryam Arshad of Impact Dynamics and Sana Shah of NICK; the conversations throughout the conference left the listeners asking deeper questions about the role of women in STEM.

From funding opportunities to differences of application of ideas based on the varying population in the country to the conservative reluctance of the families of many younger women; each session shed light on issues not generally discussed on such platforms. Such conversations are making way for women to discuss their problems and come to solutions together.

Our Cool Young Ellas session demonstrated hope for the younger girls in STEM and displayed a variety of options open to younger girls today. With a total outreach of over 10,000 views, we marked Ada Lovelace Day in Pakistan this year with a fantastic virtual gathering of our very own local champions of STEM!

#### Craft-Preneurship: Dec '22
